

GATHER ALL THINGS NEEDED TO BATH A BABY

Make sure that things that you are going to need are gathered before starting the
process and make sure that you have someone to help you in case you forgot
something or your phone rings to avoid leaving the baby unattended.

EXAMPLES OF BATHING EQUIPMENT

- Baby bath
- A bucket with a lid for solid or wet nappies
- Containers for other washing
- Clean clothing
- Clean nappies
- Soap
- Cotton wool swabs in a covered container
- Small plastic bag for used swabs
- Shampoo
- Baby powder
- Baby brush
- A bath thermometer
- A sponge
- Towels and facecloth

STEPS ON HOW TO BATH A BABY

- It is advisable to wash baby's face before putting him/her in the water by using clean pieces of cotton wool dipped in water and squeezed out.
- There is no need to use soap or cleanser on the baby's face.
- Put cold water in the bath first, then hot, so that the bath water is comfortably warm.
- Use a bath thermometer, if you have one or use your elbow, remember the water must be warm at 37 to 38 degrees Celsius.
- Make sure there's enough to allow your baby to settle in the water with his/her shoulders well covered.
- Bring your baby to the bath area, undress him and remove his nappy.
- Make sure that you support baby's head with one arm and the other hand to wash him.
- Wash the baby with water, or use a mild, liquid baby cleanser.
- Use your hand, a sponge to clean your baby from top to bottom and frond back.
- Lift the baby out of the bath, and straight on a dry towel. Wrap him/her up warm and pat him/him rather than rub, make sure is dry before putting a nappy on.
- Then wrap your baby in a dry towel to help him/ her warm and apply mild moisturising lotion or baby cream.

DRESSING A BABY

- Lay the bay down on a firm workplace Stretch the opening on the baby's vest wide open and pull it carefully over his head.
- Be careful not to catch his nose or ears.





- Hold the one sleeve of the vest open with your thumb and forefinger and pull it over the baby's fingers.
- Pull the vest over his body.
- Make use of the baby's natural grapping reflex when pulling the sleeves over his arms.
- Lift the baby up and pull the bottom part of the outfit towards his/her legs.
- Let him/her hold your middle finger while you pull the sleeves over his/her arm.
- Wrap the small baby in the blanket, babies feel more secure if they are wrapped tightly.

CLEANING THE ENVIROMENT AFTER BATHING A BABY

- Make sure the bathing equipment are washed with clean water and wiped.
- Make sure the wiped bathing equipment are kept in the safe place.
- Refresh the bathroom by opening the windows.
- Place the face cloth and baby towel on the washing line to dry up
- Clean the whole bathroom with sterilizers to kill germs.
